Science: Dichotomous Key A <u>dichotomous key</u> is a tool that helps to identify items in the natural world, such as trees, wildflowers, mammals, reptiles, rocks, and fish. A dichotomous key is a series of statements consisting of 2 choices that describe characteristics of an unidentified organism. "Dichotomous" means divided into two parts". Therefore, dichotomous keys always give two choices in each step. Activity: Choose items from your home that share characteristics (for example: toys, candy, kitchen utensils). Then create a series of statements or questions you can use to narrow them down. Take a picture of your key and share it with your teacher. It can be as dramatic as revealing the villain to be the least likely suspect.
