

# Kindergarten, Week: # 7 – May 11–May 15




- Choose **TWO** activities per day to complete.

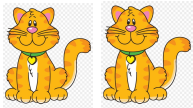
Work on iStation Reading each day.

<p>On sticky notes or squares of paper, write your numbers 0-20.</p> <p><i>*Challenge-- Mix the numbers up and put them back in the correct order*</i></p> 	<p>Think of the story The Three Little Pigs. You can watch a read aloud of the story here: <a href="http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=1WjHqT8dgeQ">http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=1WjHqT8dgeQ</a>.</p> <p>Try to build two different kinds of houses using materials at your home; Legos, blocks, playdoh, marshmallows, toothpicks, etc. Play the part of the wolf and try to blow your houses down. Was one house stronger than the other? Why?</p> 	<p>Write about a time you showed kindness to someone. What did you say or do to show kindness? Who were you kind to?</p> <p>Remember to use capital letters at the beginning of your sentences, leave spaces between words, label your pictures, and end your sentences with punctuation.</p> 	<p>Use a deck of Uno cards (or Phase Ten, Wacky Six, etc. - any deck of cards with four colors). Your exercise depends on the color of the card you flip over.</p> <p>For example,</p> <p>Blue = 10 jumping jacks</p> <p>Red = 10 sit-ups</p> <p>Yellow = jog in place (or outside around the house) 1 minute</p> <p>Green = 5 push-ups</p> <p>Wild Cards = your choice</p> <p>Each deck has many cards. Try to do 7-10 cards a day! Enjoy!</p>	<p><u>Choice 1:</u> Pick your favorite story to read. Read it out loud, or have a family member read it to you. Based on what the story is saying and the characters in the story, try to think about what instrument you would choose to accompany this story and why. Or use household items/sounds to use for each character. Have someone read the story again and you play the different instruments or sounds along with the story.</p>

Solve the story problem on a piece of paper.

I went for a walk. I saw 2 cats and 3 dogs. How many eyes did I see? How many noses? How many legs did I see?

**\*Challenge:** If each animal I saw has three toes on each paw, How many toes were there?\*

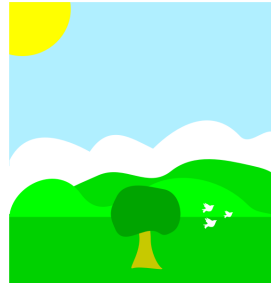


Draw a picture of a friend at school or in your neighborhood. Write or tell 2 reasons why this person is a good friend. How do they make you feel? Why?

Remember to use capital letters at the beginning of your sentences, leave spaces between words, label your pictures, and end your sentences with punctuation.

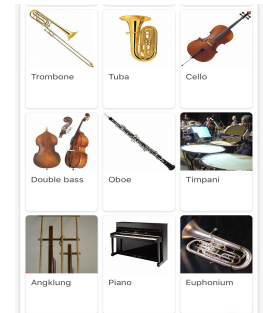
