# College Admission Testing

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The ACT and SAT are college admissions tests for academic programs (4 year) and ALEKS for professional technical programs (1-2 year). Most colleges will accept either test for admission unless it is a rigorous college with high admission standards. Important criteria for college admission are, scores on admission tests, Grade Point Average (GPA), courses students have completed in high school, and community and school involvement. A rigorous course and a lower grade are better than an easier course and a higher grade. Students will do better on the college admission tests if they have taken rigorous courses since they have been exposed to more material.

# Senior Project Information

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All graduating seniors will be required to complete a senior project. The project is composed of four major components: research paper, field experience, portfolio & reflective letter, presentation.

The senior project begins first semester in senior English class with a research paper. During second semester, with assistance from government teachers, the student designs and produces a related field experience, completes a portfolio, and prepares and delivers a formal oral presentation to a panel of judges composed of staff and community. A minimum of 15 hours must be invested in the field experience for successful completion, but an interested student often spends a great deal more time. The formal presentation includes judges' review of the portfolio and reflection paper, an 8 – 10 minute presentation, and question and answer session between student and judges. All students are assigned a faculty advisor who will work with them throughout the year. They must also select a community mentor, one who has expertise in their chosen senior project topic.
