

College and Career Advising Plan – Lewiston Independent School District

Goals

- Increase the number of students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary programs.
- Create a college-going culture designed to assist students and families with the transition from high school to college and career.

Tasks

Assist students with financial aid through evening presentations and one-on-one advising. Provide hands on assistance with the FAFSA and scholarship applications.

Advising/Academic Planning/ Career Counseling – Advise students on college and career choices or college and/or career planning. Work with students on academic planning, assisting with assessment advising or interpretation of scores or assistance with placement tests. Assist with setting up internships or job shadows.

College Visit/ College Student Shadowing – Arrange college visits and/or college student shadowing

Work closely with Lewis-Clark State College’s Early College Coordinator and Director of Dual Credit and Special Projects to increase enrollment and retention rates as well as to decrease program of study changes.

Student Workshops – Assist with FASFA night, Dual Credit Registration

Parent/Family Advising – Assist with Parent Night to provide parents with information on FASFA, as well as providing assistance to parents or guardians on their student’s college choices, college planning, and financial aid planning.
