Successes

Elementary

From September to May, Kindergarten proficiency increased 32 percentage points on the IRI, from 37% to 69%.

From September to May, 1st grade proficiency increased 18 percentage points on the IRI, from 54% to 72%.

From September to May, 2nd grade proficiency increased 14 percentage points on the IRI, from 64% to 78%.

When this group started as Kindergarteners in Fall 2019, their proficiency was 49% on the IRI, and now they are at 78% proficiency.

According to the spring IRI, less than 10% of 2nd graders are in Tier 3.

From September to May, 3rd grade proficiency increased 16 percentage points, from 60% to 76%.

On the IRI, we are outperforming the state in grades K-3 from 4 percentage points to 9 percentage points, depending on the grade.

Based on the seven elementary schools, the district's average proficiency for K-3 is 73.9%. The state's average is 68.2%.

Congratulations to Orchards Elementary whose average proficiency for K-3 is 81.7% and McSorley Elementary whose average is 81.3%.

Secondary

6th and 7th grade ELA and Math outperformed the state proficiency rates, from one to 11 percentage points.

7th grade ELA--State proficiency is 56%, and District proficiency is 69%. This was a 24 percentage point increase from last year at Jenifer, and a 15 percentage point increase at Sacajawea!

6th grade MathState proficiency is 39%, and District proficiency is 45%. 7th grade Mathstate proficiency is 40% and District proficiency is 50%.
